

Rainbow Heights Club Receives \$5,000 Matching Donation



Dear Members, Friends and Colleagues,

With fall in the air, 2010 is quickly drawing to a close. I write to you today to request your help in closing a significant gap in our revenue created by the loss this year of over \$85,000 in discretionary funding from the state of NY. As you might know, the dire economic conditions our state is facing have impacted all programs that rely, as we do, on significant government support to keep the doors open. With little hope of this funding being restored this year, we must once again turn to you for support.

Facing this challenge head on, we have been reaching out to our friends and colleagues for help. One of our members, Stephen Puibello, has mobilized his friends and supporters, raising over \$1,400.00 so far to support Rainbow Heights Club program services (see member spotlight in this issue).

Another of our supporters has pledged to match each and every donation we bring in through the end of 2010 dollar for dollar up to \$5,000, thus doubling the value of the donations we receive through December 31st. Without your help, we will have no choice but to reduce our hours, cut back on staff and unfortunately ask our consumers once again to go without...without a meal, without a support group, and many times, without a friend to just talk to.

All of our services are provided free of charge to our clients – but they all cost money. We will do everything we can to avoid reducing the critical services that we provide, but we need your help. If you are a member of Rainbow Heights Club, you know from personal experience how valuable our programs are to persons in recovery. If you are a friend or family member of someone who belongs to Rainbow Heights Club, you have seen for yourself the impact of our support on the person you love. Nearly 90% of our members stay out of the hospital and in the community each year because of the support they receive at Rainbow Heights Club. That means that they are able to stay in the community, close to you, where they belong.

If you're a mental health professional who works with clients of Rainbow Heights Club, you've also seen the impact of our work. Many therapists and case managers tell us that they've never seen their clients doing so well. The self-esteem and self-respect that people find at Rainbow Heights Club helps them to stay consistent with their mental health care – and that increases the impact of the services that you provide.

We hope that you will be able to help support us. Even a small donation sends a powerful message: that you care enough about our services to want to help them continue. Just \$35 helps us put a hot meal on the table for the 40 people who attend the club each afternoon; \$50 underwrites a weekly peer-run support group for an entire month. Please rest assured that your donations will go directly to support much-needed services. Remember that through the end of the year, all donations received will be matched by our anonymous donor. Our agency's overhead expenses are very low, mainly because Heights-Hill Mental Health Service generously donates the use of Rainbow Heights Club's space and utilities.

I personally thank you for considering sharing what you have with Rainbow Heights Club this holiday season. In hard times, we all need all the support that we can get. That's why I am reaching out to you. Thank you for your time.
